Text between the codes [r] and [n] is in reverse video. Reverse video is used for interviewer instructions throughout the questionnaire.

Code at this item begins timing the substantive portion of the interview.

The [specify] command allows the interviewer to enter unlimited open-ended text. The interviewer recorded the respondent's answer to the question verbatim.

Item cpsch53 (variable CPSA3) is part of an experiment which measured time elapsed between the end of the questions read by the interviewer and the beginning of the respondent's answer. Item cpsch51 contained interviewer instructions on the correct procedure for recording the elapsed time. The DOS version of CASES records time in hundredths of a second.

Code at this item customized the question text to read either Bloc Québécois in Quebec, or Reform Party in the rest of Canada.

The CASES internal timer was initialized upon display of this item. Elapsed time was recorded in hundredths of a second. The [no erase] command keeps the previous item displayed on screen to ensure the interviewer can see all instructions as well as the text of the question during the experiment.

The CASES internal timer was halted upon display of this item. The elapsed time was stored in cpsJF1.

The [specify] command allows the interviewer to enter unlimited open-ended text. The interviewer recorded the respondent's answer to the question verbatim.

The text of this item was customized based on the respondents answer to item cpsch53. Respondents who answered "don't know" to cpsch53 were asked "Which party are you leaning toward now?". Respondents who answered "None" to cpsch53 were asked "Is there a party you are leaning towards?".
